Spotlight on Missions: FAITHCARE

The mission of FaithCare is to bring: health, hope, & healing.

FaithCare strives to show love and compassion, while meeting physical, as well as spiritual needs.

For decades FaithCare has served hundreds of thousands of individuals physically, emotionally, and spiritually. Much of this has been done through short term mission projects, health fairs, and outreach to the neediest of this world. And while this great work will continue, we have ramped up our focus on building and establishing ongoing care facilities in our urban communities and internationally. Examples include the FaithCare-Hartford Wellness Center which served needy individuals in the inner city of Hartford, CT for over a decade. In addition, the FaithCare-PA Health Center sees patients in the inner city of Reading, PA on a regular basis. The FaithCare-PA Health Center is similarly ramping up our services, expanding visitation days, looking to incorporate additional services, along with opportunities to care for the least of these in our communities.

We have been given land in Haiti to begin similar progress towards a fully functional, missionary, teaching medical facility in that location. As we embark on establishing enduring facilities that bring Health, Hope, and Healing to the needlest of the needy in the communities and countries we are called to, the following guiding principles should always be kept in perspective:

- 1. Nobody should be refused care, regardless of their finances, race, religion, ethnicity, gender, or any other discriminator.
- 2. Every person coming for health, hope, and healing should be treated with unconditional love, compassion, and selfless care.
- 3. Everybody coming to a FaithCare facility should have the opportunity to learn how they can have peace and hope in their life.
