While this main purpose continues, we're making concerted efforts to expand the use of the Café for other groups and events. In the past few years, we've hosted all sorts of adult-oriented programs, including post-abortion healing classes, movie nights, a worship night, adult Bible classes, blood drives, parenting classes, addiction recovery groups, a cookie decorating party, and a series of community-outreach game days. We're very excited to see the increase in use of this amazing space and look forward to new and different uses of the space that help spread the Kingdom of God and the Good News of Jesus to the people in our area. If you have an idea for an event or program at the café, please let me know and we can talk about the possibilities of making it happen.

For groups using the Journey Café, we ask a few simple things:

1. Please put all tables and chairs back the way you found them. Also, please put away any other items you may have used or moved.

2. Please take out all trash. Trash goes outside in the red bins in bags (no loose trash in bins).

3. Please take all food and drink that you brought with you when you're done with your event. Please do not leave food and drink in the refrigerator or on the counters.

4. Please wash, dry and put away all mugs, utensils, dishes and coffee pots.

5. Please make sure the A/V system and lights are out, and that all doors and windows are locked when you are finished with your event.
