A Letter from our Pastor

Friends,

Since 1996, some of us in the church have shared in a life changing experience—we've gone to the Creation Festival. Earlier this year, the organizers of the festival announced that Creation was ending, but the Christian organization who owns the venue has decided to create their own festival—Agape Fest.

I thought I'd use this space to take a little trip down memory lane. The first time I went to the Creation Festival with the church I saw something that was deeply moving to me. Young people all over the arena at Hershey Park (the festival had been flooded out in its usual location) were listening to Christian praise music and raising their hands in praise of the Lord. Whether you like that style of music or not, there's something to be celebrated in seeing younger people truly worshipping God. I came away from the experience with this desire—I wanted to see every single student in Hamburg High School go to Creation. I felt that maybe somehow, they could come to trust in Jesus. It was a powerful event.

That's why we tried to get as many people as possible to come with us—in hopes that God would break through into people's lives. And I've seen it happen year after year. Actually the biggest God moments at Creation happened on Sunday mornings, after I had already gone back to church to preach. By Sunday morning, everyone was in the process of clearing the grounds on Agape Farm. Our group was also packing up to come home, but before leaving, at our own camping area, we had a worship service featuring our own people sharing testimonies. It was at that time of worship on a Sunday morning that all kinds of people shared about what God had been doing in their lives during the course of the week. Going to Creation has always been a lot of work but those testimonies made it all worthwhile. Lives were being impacted.

Some people saw the movie Jesus Revolution recently. That's a movie that told the story of the Jesus movement of the 1960s and 1970s. Some young people were leaving the drug culture of that time period and starting to follow Jesus. It was from that movement that the Creation Festival was started. At it's peak, there were probably 100,000 people who came to listen to Christian bands from around the world. It was an amazing experience, but it started with just a bunch of Christians coming together, camping out, and worshipping the Lord.

That's what I think is going to happen this year. It's going to be a lot less impressive. There will be bands, including the youth praise band from our church, playing music instead of internationally known bands. There may be some of those, but this year's event will likely be a lot more like the kind of music and experience from 1979 when it all started. If it's a powerful experience, and I have a feeling it's going to be, it's going to be because the Holy Spirit is present and moving among us.

I'm looking forward to Agape Fest this year, and if you've never shared the experience, I invite you to come along. The price is just \$25 for the food we're going to share together. The rest of the event itself is free! And the star of the show will be the Holy Spirit and whatever He decides to do among us. I'm all in for whatever unexpected adventure the Lord has in store for us.
