Letter From Our Pastor

Birth stories. I could tell the birth stories of all three of our children. In pretty much detail. And with pleasure. And excitement. Our children, their lives, my experience with them and the families they've created has been among the absolute greatest joys of my life.

Not only could I tell you about their births, I could tell you story after story from their childhood into their adult life about experiences that I've shared with them. And in telling you those stories, I would get immense pleasure. Those experiences all began when those three special people were born into my life.

This month, we celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ into our world. Through Scripture, music and sermons, we will remember all the events leading up to and including his birth. Consistory Corner

- We finalized the budget and it is available in the back of the sanctuary for congregational review.
- The **Annual Congregational Meeting** will be held on Sunday, December 8, 2024 after the third Worship Service.
 - At this meeting we will discuss 4 topics:
 - 1) A motion will be made to allow 3 Strands Community Center to utilize the east end of the Journey Cafe, for a monthly donation. 2) Approval of the Capital
 - Maintenance Budget
 - A motion will be made to proceed with the capital projects for 2025 at a cost not to exceed \$370,000, utilizing investments if necessary to cover these projects.
 - 3) Approval of the 2025 Budget 4) Suggesting the following by-law change for congregational vote:
 - Section VI Consistory subsection Business Team 1. Current language:

'All expenses not provided for by the budget proposed by the business team shall be referred to the Consistory for approval. If the expense exceeds \$10,000, it must receive the approval of the Consistory and the Congregation.'

2. Newly proposed change by Elders:

'All expenses not provided for by the budget proposed by the business team shall be referred to the Consistory for approval. If the expense exceeds 3% of the prior year's total annual budget, it must receive the approval of the Consistory and the Congregation. As a contingency for a catastrophic event, the Consistory may approve up to 10% of the prior year's total annual budget.'
