Letter From Our Pastor

Greetings Zion's Church!

I'm writing to you from an airplane on our way to the west coast of Florida for a family vacation. Yesterday was my last day at FedEx (praise God), and, in three weeks, we'll be in Hamburg to begin serving Zion's Church. Oh, and grandma is with us for the trip! The best I can do at the moment is utter a sigh of relief that God has made his will and his call clear—for me, for our family, and for Zion's Church. HAPPENINGS AT THE JOURNEY CAFE By: Dan Bailey, Youth Pastor

Here's a quick update about what's happening at the Journey Café and the ministries there.

- Renovations to the building's exterior and HVAC system are underway. This work should be completed by late May. This work is being done by Matt Ott of Modus Construction and Kerry Herbst of Tri-County HVAC.
- At Rock Us on April 9, we wrapped up a multi-week sermon series called "DTRT: Do The Right Thing". Part of the sermon that night involved two of our youth praise band members coming up and sharing some of the challenges of teens trying to "do the right thing" today.
 - Our 1st teen to speak was 11th-grader Delaney Muller, a singer in our youth praise band & Journey Church band. She recalled a recent slumber party where several of the girls tried to get Delaney to sneak out and run around the town, no doubt to get into some trouble. Delaney knew this was wrong and told the girls such. They continued to coerce her, especially since she was the only girl who had a car. Delaney successfully resisted them and no one ended up leaving. Her leadership and moral stance in doing the right thing that night helped to protect the girls from getting into trouble.
 - The 2nd young person to speak was 10th-grader Joey Seidel, youth praise band drummer and Zion's Church praise band bass player. He had a different personal story to tell, one where he had failed to do the right thing during various peer pressure situations when he was in middle school. He was blunt and honest about where that led him. Joey stated that as he trusted in Jesus more & more, he was able to resist temptation and do the right thing. But he alluded to continuing challenges, temptation and personal shortcomings in a very honest, open and vulnerable manner. He added that because God is beyond space and time, His wisdom and understanding are far beyond our simple human thoughts; therefore, we should trust in Him and His ways and He won't let us down. This thought about God helps Joey to make much better decisions and helps him resist going down dark paths. For Joey, this was a very spiritually mature and encouraging message to deliver to the other students.
 - I must add that during both students' mini testimonies, all the kids at Rock Us were really paying close attention. I am so incredibly proud of these two young Christians and for what they did to do the right thing. They are excellent role models and serve as great examples for how God is working in the hearts of our young people at the Journey!
- Our church's big youth ministry summer activity is Impact, our week-long mission/ service project. At Impact, we shine the light of Jesus into the Hamburg area by conducting a wide variety of service projects. Many of these projects involve helping widows, elderly or handicapped residents with outdoor work like painting, small carpentry repairs and gardening. We also help local non-profit organizations. We do these work projects during the day. At night we stay at the Blue Mountain Olivet Camp on

Mountain Rd. The camp has a lot of fun activities like fishing, swimming and beach volleyball. Middle and High schoolers are invited to attend. This summer, Impact '25 is from July 6 - 11. The cost is only \$25/student. We always need adult helpers too for a variety of roles. If you would like to get involved, we are very flexible about days and times of service. - With the addition of the Three Strands, the Journey Café is now open seven days a week. Here's a listing of all the things that are happening at the Journey nowadays:
 - A daily after-school program for middle/high school students (Mon-Thurs afternoons)
 - Chop-N-Chat youth cooking group for middle/high school students (Tues at 3:30pm)
 - Rock Us youth group for middle/high school students (Wed 5:45-8:30 pm)
 - Zion's Church confirmation class on Mondays (6:30pm)
 - Journey Church service at 11am on Sundays
 - Prime Timers game days (third Friday of the month at 10AM)
 - Five Adult Bible studies (various times/dates)
 - Three Strands gym (Mon-Sat, opens at 5AM)
 - 2 knitting groups (Please note that Bev & Sandy's knitting group is on hold for the summer)
- It's working out great with the Three Stands Community Center/gym. Stefani Boyer of Three Strands reported that they've picked up 80 new members since coming to the Journey in January; they now have nearly 350 members. Stefani also said, "We have many people stopping in for coffee and conversation because they see movement within our space. There is next to no time during our hours of operation that the Journey Café is empty." She also stated that the new knitters group comes twice a month and said that they wanted to come there simply because, "they love the atmosphere and friendly faces."
- We are seeing many of our teen students joining the Three Strands gym. Also, several young adults who've graduated from our youth programs are now working out at the gym. This is giving us another connection point with these young people, and our ministry efforts are being assisted by the Three Strands staff too.
- Another new addition at the Journey is PA State Powerlifting champion, Cody Wisniewski. He recently moved to Hamburg, and in January of this year, Cody began to train at the Three Strands gym. Cody is also a fairly new Christian, and he was impressed by the mission of Three Strands and the Journey Café. He told me that his goal with competitive powerlifting is to give Jesus Christ all the glory. We are blessed to have Cody at the Three Strand/Journey Café, and who knows what impact he will make for Christ's Kingdom.
- Finally, the Journey Church is going good. The service starts at 11AM (doors open at 10:30). Each week we have honest worship, excellent presentation of God's Word, impacting discussion times, and great fellowship. We were recently blessed when 2 people that we met through the Journey Church took Pastor Randy's final membership class and formally joined Zion's Church. These include Zac Baker and McKayla Gustaveson, both of whom are young adults. We welcome them into the Zion's Church family!
