JOURNEY café School-Year Wrap-up

We're wrapping up the '24-'25 school year at the Journey Café. We thank God for a really great year. Both our After-School Program & Rock Us youth group were really well-attended this past school year. Each week at Rock Us, we shared the Good News of Jesus with dozens of young people in many engaging and impactful ways. There is no doubt that many spiritual seeds were planted. We also witnessed many excellent "God moments" throughout the year and saw many youths growing and maturing in their faith, especially during our small group discussion times at Rock Us. I want to extend a heartfelt 'thank you' to all the excellent volunteers that made this past school year possible and to you, the members of Zion's Church, for supporting all the youth ministry efforts at the Journey over the past 18 years.

IMPACT '25 YOUTH MISSION WEEK

As we begin to move from our school-year schedule into our summer programs, we're getting more and more excited about Impact '25, our week-long youth mission project. This year's Impact, which is scheduled from Sunday July 6 through Friday July 11, will be the eighteenth year of doing our own homegrown, local service/missions project. The main purpose of Impact is to introduce 6th through 12th grade youths to the idea of mission work and serving others by serving the people of our town in the Name of Jesus. This is accomplished through service work primarily at the homes of elderly and disabled people in the Hamburg area.

Another big component of Impact '25 is our "Random Acts of Kindness" outreaches during which we share the love & hope of Jesus in free & fun ways with the people of Hamburg. These include stuff like a free carwash at the Journey, making crafts and giving them to senior citizens in our area, etc.

A super-fun aspect of Impact is where we stay: the Blue Mountain Olivet Camp on Mountain Ave in Hamburg. The camp has all sorts of fun things for the teens to do after our workday, like boating, fishing, swimming, beach volleyball, etc.

Impact costs only \$25/person for the entire week. This fee helps to offset the costs of the projects and includes three meals per day, snacks, drinks, camping, and transportation to and from the campsite for work assignments.

JOURNEY CAFÉ REFURBISHMENT UPDATE

Work is well underway with the refurbishment of the Journey. So far, the three old/faulty HVAC units for the main part of the building have been replaced. Work is underway to add 4-season-capable HVAC in the gym portion of the building. New metal siding is being installed and it is now covering much of the rear of the structure; the remaining portions of the building will be sided soon. Five new commercial steel doors have been installed to replace the former inadequate domestic-grade doors. We are also currently in the process of replacing five patio doors which had served as windows with proper commercial windows. The final things to be done will be to install the decorative stonework to the Pine Street and Third Street sides of the building; this will be done after the siding installation is complete in these areas. After this is all completed, the Journey will be a fully-functional, weather-tight building with a fresh, new look. We hope to have a "Grand Reopening" public event sometime after this is all done as well.

THREE STRANDS NEWS

Recently, I was very ill with one of the worst colds that I've ever had. In this condition, I was too sick to help out at the Prime Timers' game day that happens every third Friday at the Journey. In fact, I was so out of it (and bedridden) that I forgot that the game day was even happening. But Katie Riegel of the Three Strands stepped up and hosted the gamers in the main room at the Journey and served them drinks during the event. The attendees were blessed and well-served by Katie. My hat's off to her for helping and stepping up without me even asking her! This is the kind of excellent people that run the Three Strands Gym & Community Center. We are truly blessed to have such fine people right in our midst.

A common sentiment from people coming to the Three Strands in their new location at the Journey Café is: "This is such a happy, positive and welcoming place." One of the main workers helping to refurbish the Journey (a man named Chris) said of the Journey/Three Strands, "This is the happiest place he's ever worked." He was so impressed about the operation that he bought a Three Strands hat to financially support it. I (Dan B) have observed that during the refurbishment of the cafe, the Three Strands people have been very helpful & accommodating to the men working on the Journey. Again, this is a blessing, especially since I couldn't be there all the time when I was sick.

Finally, The Three Strands is helping to really change lives. Recently, a 68-year-old woman began consistently working out at the gym pretty much every day that they're open. She was struggling with weight issues, depression and sleep apnea. The Three Strands people helped her develop a workout routine and it has proven very effective for her. At a recent doctor's visit, her doctor said, "These numbers for your blood work are so different that I feel that I'm looking at someone else's chart!" The best news is now this lady was able to stop taking her antidepression meds and no longer needs to use the CPAP machine. Her doctors are totally amazed and dumbfounded. After the doctor's visit, the lady hugged Stef Boyer (of Three Strands) and was sobbing in joy & thankfulness. "You people have changed my life!", she said through her tears. This is really amazing stuff! If you'd like to experience some amazing lifechange through better fitness and through meeting some folks who love people, love God and want to expand His Kingdom, please consider coming down to the Three Strands.
