Letter from our Pastor

Greetings Zion's Church Family,

I pray that each of you is thriving in the goodness and lovingkindness of our God! I'd like to give you a brief update on our family's housing situation and then share a word of encouragement that the Lord has been impressing on my heart.

By God's grace, we were able to close on our home and move in. This was, remarkably, our third move since arriving in the area! We had a plethora of help—friends from Zion's, neighbors, and even brothers and sisters from The Heart of Christ Church right here in Jonestown. It was a beautiful picture of the body of Christ in action. What could have been exhausting became a testimony of God's care. Our family is new to the area, so we had to depend entirely on the Lord to make this transition possible. And He did. Truly, "The Lord will provide" (Genesis 22:14).



Now that we are somewhat settled—surrounded by a tidal wave of boxes—we've had a few moments to reflect. A few months before this move, the Lord spoke something quietly but clearly to my heart: "Do not despise the provisions of the Lord." Those words have stayed with me, echoing through each step of the journey. His provisions have been abundant, yet sometimes bittersweet. One such bittersweet aspect is that our new home is farther from the church building than we'd hoped. But even here, God's gentle reminder still whispers: "Do not despise the provisions of the Lord."

A few nights ago, when I couldn't sleep, I felt prompted to think about our new home and our street name—Sweetbriar Lane. The irony made me smile. A "sweet-briar" is a beautiful flower that grows among thorns—a perfect symbol of the bitter-sweetness of life in Christ. Our Father surely has a sense of humor! Even when the path is lined with briars, His grace still makes it sweet.

The apostle Paul once wrote, "In everything give thanks, for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus concerning you" (1 Thessalonians 5:18). That's the posture I believe God is calling us to as a church—gratitude even in the bittersweet, faith even in the uncertain, joy even when the way seems longer than expected. Because when we trust His heart, we find that every provision—no matter how small, strange, or "briar-sweet"—is another expression of His love.

May we, as a church family, never despise what the Lord provides. Instead, may we cherish every gift, every challenge, and every unexpected road as part of His good plan.


